Chautauqua County Lakes and Waterways Grant Applications Available

The Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Economic Development has announced applications for the Chautauqua County 2017 Occupancy/ Bed Tax Grants for Lakes and Waterways are now available.

The Occupancy Tax Grants for Lakes and Waterways are funded through the county's five percent occupancy or bed tax for the rental of lodging units within the county. Two-fifths or two percent of the bed tax is used solely for the enhancement and protection of lakes and waterways in the Chautauqua County.

"While most New York counties collect an occupancy tax, Chautauqua County is unique in the way we reinvest the revenue to improve our lakes and waterways through the 2% program, which in turn attracts more tourism dollars," said Dave McCoy, Chautauqua County Watershed Coordinator. "There is simply no other program like it in New York State."

These grants provide \$500 to \$40,000 in funding for projects to be implemented from January 1 through December 31, 2017.

"Generally, projects located within the Lake Erie, Bear Lake, Cassadaga Lakes, Findley Lake and Chautauqua Lake watersheds are eligible," said Dave Spann, Chairman of the Chautauqua County Water Quality Task Force.

Applications may be submitted by various groups and organizations including; not-for-profits, governments, businesses and corporations, public and private schools, and all landowners of Chautauqua County. Successful projects funded under this program include but are not limited to: streambank, shoreline, or ditch stabilization; sediment retention basins; watergardens; buffer strips; and habitat improvement projects.

"We have funded some very beneficial and

creative projects since the Occupancy Tax Program's inception," said Chautauqua County Executive Vince Horrigan. "Through the program, we are making meaningful improvements to the water quality in our lakes and streams and we encourage Chautauqua County residents and agencies to apply."

"During the 2016 round we were able to fund nine projects for approximately \$200,000, which will be constructed this summer," said McCoy. "Those projects included riparian buffers and streambank stabilization projects."

Applications and instructions for the grant are available online at www.co.chautauqua. ny.us/519/Project-Funding; or www. planningchautauqua.com by clicking on the watershed management link and navigating to "2% Bed Tax Grants."

Completed applications are due by 4 p.m. on June 1, 2016 and should be mailed to: Mr. Dave McCoy, Watershed Coordinator, Chautauqua County Department of Planning & Economic Development, 200 Harrison St., Suite 300, Jamestown, 14701.

Submitted projects will be evaluated and ranked by the Chautauqua County Water Quality Task Force Waterways Panel. The panel's ranked list will then be provided in August 2016 to the Chautauqua County Legislature for its approval.

"The previous round of the 2% Lakes & Waterways Grant Program received just 19 applications, and with nine awards, the chances of winning are very high when compared to other non-local grant programs that might receive hundreds of applications," said Erin Brickley, Executive Director of the Chautauqua Lake and Watershed Alliance. "Grant awards range from \$5,000 to \$40,000, and although no matching funds are required, it's good to include private investment and in-kind services when applying for funding for larger projects."

Students & Families Learn More About Cycles of Nature with Visit from Live Chicken

Lincoln Elementary School students in Roslyn Sisley-Kazelunas, Wendy Lindstrom, Kimberly Knight, and Laurie Hind's second grade classes invited parents to spend a morning learning and experiencing a variety of activities to strengthen their child's knowledge of cycles of nature.

The second grade welcomed not only parents, but also community member, Victor Marcum from Marcum Farms. Mr. Marcum shared his knowledge of the life cycle of a chicken. This was one of the many cycles the students have been learning about during class. Marcum Farms is home to different

types of chickens and he was able to share his wealth of knowledge. Students and parents were also able to pet the chicken, candle an egg, and touch the chicken feed. Parents then returned to their child's classroom where they recorded facts they had learned, dissected a hard boiled egg, labeled the life cycle of the chicken with vocabulary words they had been learning, and created an art project to take home.
